Wait, Wait For What?

Matthew 14:32

People today, we don't like to wait!

Matthew uses the word immediately 3 separate times:

•Matthew 14:22 - And straightway Jesus constrained his disciples to get into a ship, and to go before him unto the other side, while he sent the multitudes away.

Immediately = Jesus makes disciples go ahead of him.

Matthew uses the word immediately 3 separate times:

•Matthew 14:27 - But straightway Jesus spake unto them, saying, Be of good cheer; it is I; be not afraid.

Immediately = Jesus answers them when they cry out in fear.

Matthew uses the word immediately 3 separate times:

•Matthew 14:31 - And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt?

Immediately = Peter begins to sink and cried out for help

Romans divided the night into four shifts:

- •6pm 9pm
- •9pm Midnight
- •Midnight 3am
- ·3am 6am

Matthew 14:25 - And in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went unto them, walking on the sea.

Types of waiting we experience in life:

Waiting may be the hardest thing we are called to do

Psalms 37:7 - Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him:

Why? Why does God make us Wait?

- 1. To Master the art of "Delayed Gratification"
- 2. Waiting on God requires uncomplaining trust from us.

2 Peter 3:8

But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day.

- <u>2 Peter 3:9</u> The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.
- <u>2 Peter 3:9</u> The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. ESV

3. Waiting on God requires secure humbleness

Isaiah 32:17- And the work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance for ever.

4. Waiting on God requires hope

Romans 8:24 - For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? Romans 8:25 - But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it.

Isaiah 40:30 - Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall:

Isaiah 40:31 - But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew *their* strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.
